

Professor Heinz Jeroch

Foreign Member of the Lithuanian Academy of Sciences since 2007

Professor, dr. agr. habil., Dr. hc Heinz Jeroch is a German scientist in the field of animal nutrition (in particular poultry).

Date and place of birth: 30 October, 1933, Barzig (Germany)

Higher education, doctoral studies, study visits:

From 1954 to 1960, he studied agricultural sciences at Friedrich Schiller University Jena.

In 1964, he defended a doctoral thesis in Jena.

In 1970, was conferred the title of associate professor.

In 1991, Prof. Jeroch defended his habilitation thesis at Jena University.

Direction of research: Biomedical sciences (Zootechnics).

Professional experience:

In 1960, he started work as a research assistant at the Animal Nutrition Institute of Jena University.

In 1966, Jeroch was appointed senior research fellow and head of research group 'Nutrition of birds, vitamins, and ergotropics'.

In 1976, he was awarded the Humboldt Prize.

In 1977 he was invited to teach the discipline of animal nutrition at the Karl Marx University in Leipzig and worked there until 1989.

In the same year, the Martin Luther University offered him professorship and the Department of Animal Feed Preservation and Animal Nutrition.

In 1993/94, he was the dean of the Faculty of Agriculture of the University of Halle.

Until 1999, he headed the Institute of Agricultural and Nutrition Sciences of the Martin-Luther-

University Halle-Wittenberg. Professor Heinz Jeroch, worked at the University of Halle-Wittenberg

until his retirement (2002). But he did not want to be a pensioner yet and therefore went to Kaunas

as professor with the Emeritus Program of the German Academic Exchange Service.

From 2000 to 2004, he was an invited professor at the Lithuanian veterinary Academy and the

Lithuanian Agricultural University. In 2004/05 at the University of South Bohemia in the Czech

Republic.

In 2010 he was awarded of the title of Honorary Professor of UWM in Olsztyn, for scientific

achievements include over 250 creative works and 22 books published in five languages.
