

Dr Tomas Čelkis is an assistant professor at the Faculty of History of Vilnius University and a research professor at the Faculty of Communication. In 2011, he defended his doctoral dissertation 'Power and Space: The Process of Territorialisation in the Grand Duchy of Lithuania in the Fourteenth–Sixteenth Centuries' at Vilnius University. From 2012 to 2014, he conducted a postdoctoral fellowship at the Lithuanian Institute of History, with the topic: 'The Formation of the Land Road Network in the Grand Duchy of Lithuania in the Fourteenth–Seventeenth Centuries.' His research areas include studies in the historical geography of the Grand Duchy of Lithuania, the history of cartography, political history, research and publication of historical sources. Dr Čelkis has prepared two monographs, three source publications (together with others), and has published 30 scholarly articles in Lithuanian and foreign journals. He has led three national projects, participated in the implementation of two projects, and presented papers at international and national conferences.

Currently, he gives lectures to students at Vilnius University. He is an expert for the Lituanistika international database (since 2016) and a scientific expert at Vilnius University (since 2018). He actively promotes history science by giving public lectures, doing interviews in various media, and consulting documentary filmmakers on historical matters. In 2014, Dr Čelkis was a laureate of the Young Scientists' Scholarship of the Lithuanian Academy of Sciences and in 2015, he was awarded the Rector's Prize of Vilnius University as the best young researcher of Vilnius University.
