



Dr Ignas Kalpokas is an associate professor at Vytautas Magnus University. His field of research encompasses political communication, information warfare and disinformation studies, media transformations, media theory and philosophy, and, more broadly, the societal impact of new and emerging information technologies.

Dr Ignas Kalpokas completed his PhD in 2015 at the University of Nottingham and has been working at the Public Communication Department of Vytautas Magnus University ever since. In addition to his teaching and research commitments, he also heads the Department's MA programme in Future Media and Journalism and sits on the committee of a joint Vytautas Magnus University and Vilnius Gediminas Technical University PhD programme in communication studies.

Dr Ignas Kalpokas has published six books with international academic publishers (Routledge, Palgrave Macmillan, Springer Nature, Emerald) and more than 30 academic articles and book chapters, has edited a book himself, and sits on the editorial board of *SN Social Sciences*, an academic journal published by Springer Nature. In addition to publishing, he also actively participates in international conferences and has presented more than 20 papers there. He is actively involved in public dissemination of academic research, delivering lectures, seminars, and workshops to high school students both at events organised by his university and in collaboration with NGOs, schools, and public libraries. He comments regularly on current events and broader societal trends on TV and radio as well as online and in print news media. For his achievements, Dr Ignas Kalpokas has been awarded the Vytautas Magnus University Commendation Scholarship and the Michael Cowan and Sir Francis Hill Awards. His other highlights include externally funded research and teaching visits to the universities of Pavia (Italy) and Leuven (Belgium) and participation in the Fulbright programme at Marymount University in the USA.
